## **Grading Policy**

Please refer to this document for a detailed explanation. Daniel Ninth Grade English Department will adhere to the guidelines in the above referenced document.

### **Formative Assessment/Grades**

Per grading period, there will be nine formative grades weighted at 40%.

Students will have a one time opportunity to redo formative assignments in which they score below a 100% after they attend a tutorial/reteach session.

The gradebook will reflect the higher of the two grades.

Students are responsible for initiating the reteach/redo process no later than 5 days after the grade is posted.

### **Summative Assessment/Grades**

Per grading period, there will be three summative grades weighted at 60%.

Students will have a one time opportunity to redo summative assignments in which they scored 79% or lower after they attend a tutorial/reteach session.

The maximum redo grade to be reflected in the gradebook will be 80%.

Students are responsible for initiating the reteach/redo process no later than 5 days after the grade is posted.

## **Late Work Policy**

A Campus-wide Late Work Policy has been adopted. All students will be given the opportunity to submit late work for some credit. Points will be deducted for late work according to the following:

- 1 Day Late = 10 points deducted
- 2 Days Late = 20 points deducted
- 3 Days Late = 30 points deducted
- After 3 Days Late = No grade higher than a 50% will be given

Students who have an excused absence from school will be given that number of days to seek tutorials and complete the missed assignments. Please speak with your teacher to make other arrangements for extenuating circumstances.

Not having the appropriate device or materials in class is not an acceptable excuse for not having assignments in on time.

### **Cell Phone Policy**

Per Aledo ISD policy, cell phones are not an acceptable device to be used for BYOD and will not be permitted to be used for that purpose at school. Per Daniel Ninth Grade Campus policy, students will turn off and put away cell phones, earbuds, and headphones before entering the classroom. Cell phones, earbuds, and headphones will not be taken out until the student has left the classroom unless the teacher directs the use of the cell phone as an instructional tool. These activities will be directed and monitored by the teacher.
