Lesson Delivery (What do we want you to learn?):

- A group of people, known as progressives, believed that governmental action would bring about moderate political change and social improvement.
- The Progressive Era reforms included things such as new labor laws, changes to education, improvements to public safety, and prohibition.
- The reforms instituted during the Progressive Era affected Texans in both a positive and negative manner.
- The Galveston Hurricane of 1900 impacted Texas politically, economically, and socially.
- The Mexican Revolution led to distrust between whites and hispanics and renewed conflict between Texas and Mexico.
- World War I had many social and economic effects on Texas.
- After the war, the era known as the Roaring 20's saw a period with a booming economy, social changes, and further political reforms.
