
#### **Texas ISD Enrollment Change**









Region 10 &11 Enrollment Trends

- Aledo ISD enrollment has risen by 1,474 students between 2015/16 and 2020/21, an increase of 28.1%
- Aledo ISD enrollment increased 286 students from 2019/20, an increase of 4.4%
- Region 10 has seen an overall enrollment decline of 17,918 students from 2019/20, a decline of -2.2%
- Region 11 enrollment has declined -2.9% from 2019/20, a difference of 17,104 students






Average New vs. Existing Home Sale Price, 2010 - YTD 2021



- These campuses enrolled nearly 367,000 students in 2020/21, a rise of nearly 30,000 students over last year




